Present: All commissioners.

Roads

Mr. John Hodges was in regarding McKay's Beach Road. There is a bad flooding situation here and a deep dip in the road. Mr. Hall said he could fill the road in about 3 feet deep and take the hook out at the same time, at a cost of approximately \$2,000.00. This road is surface treated and have talked about paving it with bituminous concrete. Metal pipe, 18", would be used, which is equivalent to a 24" pipe of concrete. This area is about 600' and can be taken out of the Estimated Balances Available for Projects, \$25,000.00. This road is one that Mr. Hall recommended for blacktopping and he will work up a definite estimate to present to the commissioners, who agreed that this should be done.

Snow Hill Manor - have to follow the old road or the people here will object. Breton's Bay Subdivision - about \$100 worth of work to be done before the county can take these over. Mr. Hall and the commissioners reviewed those roads paved and those gravelled in this area. Mr. Waring will be asked to come in to meet with the commissioners on this matter next week. Clayton's Marina Road will be finished tomorrow, according to Mr. Hall.

Mr. Hall said he is working on the estimates of the roads to be blacktopped and they are running dose to his original figures. He will get estimate on the Wilson Butler Road. Said he has received no ruling as to whether or not the SRC will lend snow fence, as no decision has been made at this time. He will present list of roads to be started on the oiling schedule to the commissioners next week.

School Construction - Mr. Tilp

Mr. Tilp said Mr. Passerelli has several contractors who are very acceptable. He said the job on the senior high school will continue properly and he (Mr. Tilp) will do everything to get this done and see that it is completed.

Mr. Tilp said he would be glad to answer any questions the commissioners might have, and Mr. Burch asked about the ceiling in the courthouse. Mr. Tilp said that the heat and cold have caused contraction and expansion and this is the trouble. He will get the accoustical engineer man from the Armstrong Company to come to the courthouse, and this man will be here within the next two weeks.

School Bond Issue Funds

Mr. Donaldson reported that bids had been received from the three banks contacted regarding depositing of these funds. They have been deposited in the Maryland National Bank, in government bills and certificates of deposit, backed by government securities that are guaranteed 100%. Interest to be earned for the duration of the deposit will be approximately \$44,000.00

Remainder of day spent working on the budget with Mr. Donaldson.
