## Hospital Entrance Street

The secretary reported to the commissioners that Mr. James Mattingly, who had done the water and sewage work at the nursing home, had come in to inquire as to whether or not the commissioners want him to replace the asphalt he had removed in the process of his work. He has stated that if not, then he will have to refund some of the money paid to him for the work. He mentioned that the manhole was installed at the grade given him at the time, and then the street level was raised later on. If he has to adjust the grade on the manhole, then this will be an extra cost.

General discussion concerning this and the commissioners agreed they would inspect the site physically, and then make a decision.

## Sewage Plant Access Road

General discussion concerning request made by Mr. J. Kenney for the county to build and maintain the access road to the plant to be built in Lexington Park. The commissioners agreed that funds to build such a road should come out of the bond issue monies.

## Youth Commission

Mr. A. Barthleme stated that he has been giving dances in the county school, but has been denied use of the Leonardtown School for such dances by letter from Mr. Bodine. There is going to be a five state dance on January 15th and he cannot find a place to have it. The School Board has adopted the policy of allowing the principal of a school to control use of the school facilities, according to Mr. Barthleme. The commissioners informed him that this is a matter for the School Board to settle, and suggested that the chairman of the Youth Commission write to Dr. King to accomplish this. Mr. Barthleme said that he would have this done.

## Hickory Hill Road Grade Change

Mr. Pantaleo present. It was agreed that Mr. Pantaleo, the commissioners, and Mr. Peddicord of the SRC would meet to discuss the matter of the requested grade change at Station 72 + 50 on this road. The meeting will be at the project site tomorrow morning.
